# POSTAL TELEGRAPH-CABLE COMPANY.

This Company transmits and delivers the within message subject to the following **TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

To guard against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message should order it **REPEATED**; that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this, one half the regular rate is charged in addition. It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the face hereof and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, that said Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, if a **REPEATED** message, beyond the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any **REPEATED** message beyond fifty times the sum received for sending the same, unless specially insured. In any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruption in the working of its lines, or for errors in cipher or omission of messages. And this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward any message over the lines of any other Company when necessary to reach its destination.

**Insurances.** In the transmission of messages to any point on the lines of the Company can be insured by contracting in writing, stating agreed amount of risk, and payment of premium thereon, at the following rates, in addition to the usual charge for repeated messages, viz: one per cent. for any distance not exceeding 1000 miles, and two per cent. for any greater distance.

No responsibility regarding messages attaches to this Company until they same are presented and accepted at the office of the transmitting office; and if a message is sent to such office by one of this Company's messengers, he adds to that purpose as the agent of the sender.

Messengers will be delivered free within the established free delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery over greater distance a special charge will be made to cover the cost of such delivery.

This Company will not be liable for damages or satisfactory penalties in any case where the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the company for transmission.

This is an **UNREPEATED** Message and is delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors can be repaired against only by returning a message back the sending station for comparison.

No employee of this Company is authorized to vary the foregoing.
