

Sir :-

Replying to your letter of the 26th ult. marked "Education" covering transfer of Malcolm W. Odell to the position of Superintendent of the Pottawatomie School, Kansas, at a salary of \$900 per annum, and of Mrs. Kittie Odell, matron; the transfer of Dr. Clark, of the Chemawa School to this school as Physician, I have to respectfully advise you that after an unusual delay and contrary to the statement of Mr. Potter, Supt. of the Chemawa School, Dr. and Mrs. Clark advised me by telegraph thru Mr. Campbell yesterday afternoon, that they did not desire to transfer. When at Chemawa some time ago, Dr. Clark said to me that whenever there was a chance he would be glad to be considered an applicant for the position here, and Mr. Potter when here assured me that he would be glad to come and he would be perfectly willing to spare him provided he could have someone who was with him at Cherokee, now in the Pension Office.

Under these circumstances I took the matter up by phone and am sorry to have burdened the Office with something that seems now to have been entirely unnecessary.
