

Sir :-

In reply to Office letter "Education", bearing date of Feb. 24th, 1902, I have the honor to state that Marion Lambert at her own urgent request was found a place in Bellevue Hospital where she might obtain training as a nurse. It would be a great misfortune to her to secure a position that would take her away from the opportunities she has to complete a course that will be of such great benefit to her. She attended school at Carlisle only about a month before being placed in a country home. I would therefore recommend that she be not given a place at present, for the reason that our acquaintance with her is too limited to warrant endorsing her, and that she ought to continue her course in the hospital. I do not think that at present her preparation is sufficient to enable her to be of any particular service in an Indian school while she might be of great service at the end of her training in New York.

In this connection, if you have a vacancy I would suggest the appointment of Miss Ida Wheelock, a recent graduate of this school, whose application is on file in your office.
