

Sir :

Replying to yours of May 16th marked "Education, 20966", I respectfully invite your attention to the fact that in my estimate for salaries for the ensuing year I have omitted the position of Outing Agent and have made a salary of \$720 for an Assistant Disciplinarian.

It has been practically impossible to have the extra time of the outing agent while here at the school properly utilized. Being outing agent alone and new to the business, he has not been disposed to get into the school life as much as is necessary to enable him to understand his duties, the boys and the work here properly. The outing agent should be among the boys when here and so constantly equipping himself with knowledge of their qualities. For the ensuing year it is my plan to use Mr. Howard E. Gansworth, one of our graduates, also a graduate of Princeton University, for this work. No Civil Service complications will follow because he is an Indian.
