

Referring to your letter of June 1st, marked education 37295, 1902, in reference to Lyman Hare, whose mother, Mrs. Louisa Longfinger wishes him to visit her this summer, I have to respectfully advise you that Lyman Hare came to us in 1899 for a five years' term, and is therefore not due to return home this year. However, on account of his predominance of white blood, I shall return him as soon as he comes back to Carlisle from his summer outing, which will be about the middle of September.
