POSTAL TELEGRAPH-CABLE COMPANY.

This Company transmits and delivers the within message subject to the following **TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

To guard against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message should order it **RETEATED**; that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this, one-half the regular rate is charged in addition. It is agreed between the sender of the message written on the face hereof and the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company that said Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any **UNREPEATED** message, beyond the amount received for standing the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any **REPEATED** message beyond fifty times the sum received for sending the same, unless specially insured, nor in any case of delay arising from unavoidable interruption in the working of its lines, or for errors in cipher or centre messages. And this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward any message over the line of any other Company when necessary to reach its destination.

Correctness in the transmission of messages to any point on the lines of the Company can be **INSURED** by contract in writing, stating agreed amount of risk, and payment of premium thereon, at the following rates, in addition to the usual charge for repeated messages, viz: one per cent. for any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles, and two per cent. for any greater distance.

No responsibility regarding messages attaches to this Company until the same are presented and accepted at one of its transmitting offices; and if a message is sent to such office by one of this Company's messengers, he acts for that purpose as the agent of the sender.

Messengers will be delivered free within the established free-delivery limits of the terminal office. For delivery at a greater distance a special charge will be made to cover the cost of such delivery.

This Company will not be liable for damages or tortious liability in any case where the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the Company or transmission.

This is an **UNREPEATED** Message and is delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors can be claimed against only by repeating a message in both the sending station for comparison.
