Scales' leaving the Carlisle school and whether she would accept the position of Principal Teacher at Fort Sill at \$720, I have to respectfully advise you that I have no objections to Miss Scales' leaving Carlisle and have told her my rule in such cases. Wherever any employe at Carlisle can advance his interests or secure a place more to his liking elsewhere I shall never restrain him in the slightest; but Miss Scales herself says after the fullest consideration that she prefers remaining at Carlisle at \$600 to accepting the other position.
