

Sir :

Referring to my application for a domestic science teacher for this school and your notice that Miss Lile G. Deeters of Mechanicsburg, Pa. and Miss Mary E. Richardson of Harrisburg have been certified to your office, and to our conversation at Mohonk in reference to Miss Ferree, I have the honor to state that Miss Ferree is an exceptionally good woman though not highly educated, is very industrious and is well liked by all our people here and by the students, and does excellent work in her department, not technically perhaps as it might be done by a regularly trained domestic science teacher, but in all probability more practically than a trained teacher would. Her leaving the school would be a source of regret.

Confirming my telegram of this date, if Miss Ferree who has passed the matron's examination can be assigned elsewhere as matron and immediately transferred here as domestic science teacher, I request that that be done.
