
To The Honorable,

Sir :

I wish now to renew my request of Aug. 19th, 1902 that the position of Normal Teacher at \$720 at this school be abolished and the position of Assistant Principal and Normal Teacher at \$1,000 be established.

We have today present at the school 679 pupils, which number will be still further increased. The remaining 309 now attending public and other schools in the country under our outing also fall under the care of this department. I expect my principal and my teachers to keep in correspondence with their pupils out from the school, and require monthly reports from the teachers in the public schools they attend, and these are reviewed and considered by the school department here. This very greatly increases the work to be done, and as is readily seen, calls for considerable help to the principal. The reports of the visiting agent in regard to the progress of out students have also to be considered by the educational department. I add these features to my former statements, and trust my request may not be side-tracked and held in abeyance as the former one was until I got tired and recalled it.
