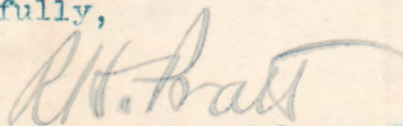

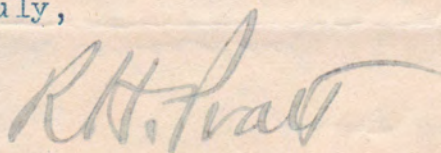
Mr. John Javine,
