Sir :

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of office letter dated July 18th, "Education 44246 - 1903", relative to an examination to be given by the Civil Service Commission to obtain eligibles for the position of Drawing Teacher at this school.

The circular I notice limits the examination to females. It is a matter of regret that only ladies are admitted to this examination as it seems more likely we should obtain what the school needs from the other sex. There is no objection to a lady if she fills all the requirements, but for the mechanical drawing especially it is probable the place could be most acceptably filled by a gentleman. If the restriction could be removed so that members of either sex could take the examination the chances of securing a satisfactory employe would be greatly improved.
