## DRAWING TEACHER.

AUGUST 26-27, 1903.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an examination on August 26-27, 1903, at the places mentioned in the accompanying list, to secure eligibles from which to make certification to fill a vacancy in the position of drawing teacher at the Carlisle School, Pennsylvania, at \$720 per annum, and other similar vacancies as they may occur.

This examination is open to both men and women.

The examination will consist of the subjects mentioned below, which will be weighted as follows:

<i>Subjects.</i>	<i>Weights.</i>
1. Arithmetic, mensuration, and elementary algebra.....	10
2. Pedagogy, with special reference to the teaching of drawing .....	15
3. Penmanship .....	5
4. Spelling and copying (an exercise of about ten lines of ordinary prose containing twenty or more misspelled words).....	5
5. English grammar and analysis (as comprised in the common school text-books) .....	10
6. History, Constitution, and Government of the United States (comprising matter found in the grammar school text-books).....	5
7. Drawing, freehand (practical tests) .....	15
8. Drawing, mechanical (practical tests) .....	15
9. Physiology and hygiene (embracing matter found in the grammar school text-books) ..	5
10. Nature study (topics relative to the development, growth, habits, and peculiarities of animals and plants, and methods of interesting pupils in a study of the same).....	10
11. American literature (as covered in the elementary text-books on this subject) .....	5
Total.....	100

Two days are required for this examination. The first six subjects will be given on the first day, and the remaining subjects on the second day.

Age limit, 20 years or over.

This examination is open to all citizens of the United States who comply with the requirements. Competitors will be rated without regard to any consideration other than the qualifications shown in their examination papers, and eligibles will be certified strictly in accordance with the civil service law and rules.

Persons who desire to compete should at once apply to the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., or to the secretary of the local board of examiners at the places mentioned in the accompanying list, for application Form 1312, which should be properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington. In applying for this examination the exact title as given at the head of this announcement should be used in the application.

Persons who are unable to file their formal applications and who notify the Commission of this fact, either by letter or telegram, with the request that they be permitted to take the examination, will be examined, subject to the subsequent filing of their applications in complete form, provided their requests are received at the Commission in sufficient time to ship examination papers.
