Sir :

Replying to your letter of December 19th marked "Education, 81305", I have to respectfully advise you that Mr. Allen wrote to Dr. Seabrook in Philadelphia, under whose auspices Seichu Atsyé passed through the school for nurses at the Woman's Hospital. Dr. Seabrook replies as follows :

"Seichu Atsyé is a graduate of the training school connected with this hospital and I think I can safely say that she will probably fill an appointment in the Indian Service better than most applicants will.

She is neat, careful and capable, and can be trusted to do good work. Confidentially, I do not know how much executive ability she possesses in the line of managing a hospital, but as far as the work of a nurse, pure and simple, goes - she is all right. "

While here Seichu was one of our best girls all through her school life and graduated with the class of 1899. I certainly think it worth while to give her an appointment provided she can pass the examination.
