
Sir :

On my return from a short absence I find that my secretary, Miss Peter, has been promised a position in the Indian Office by the Commissioner at a salary of \$900 per annum, which is an increase over her present salary of \$120.

Her value to the service is greater here than it could be there because of her complete knowledge of all the multitudinous ramifications of our school interests and correspondence. I think the added salary entirely deserved, and as there is no desire to leave Carlisle except for the increased salary I respectfully request that the salary for one position as clerk at this school be increased to \$900.
