SPECIFICATIONS

FOR

Groceries, Crockery, Furniture, Harness, Agricultural Implements, Wagons, Paints, Tinware, Stoves, etc., for the Indian Service for the fiscal year 1905, referred to in the foregoing proposal.

AS THE FOLLOWING SPECIFICATIONS MUST BE ACCEPTED BY BIDDERS, AND, SO FAR AS APPLICABLE, MADE A PART OF THEIR PROPOSALS AND ANY CONTRACT EXECUTED THEREUNDER, PARTICULAR ATTENTION IS INVITED THERETO:

Bids will be opened at Nos. 265-267 South Canal Street, Chicago, Ill., in the presence of the Board of Indian Commissioners, a committee to be designated by the Secretary of the Interior, and any bidders who may attend, and read publicly, commencing at 1 p. m., Tuesday, May 3, 1904. Bidders are invited to be present.

Each bid must contain the names of all parties interested in or parties to it.

Bidders must designate their places of business and post-office addresses.

Bids from persons who have in any respect defaulted in any bid heretofore made will not be considered. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids, or any part of any bid, if deemed for the best interests of the Government, also to waive defects. The unit price must be stated and will govern in case of error.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or draft upon some United States depository, or solvent National Bank, payable to the order of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs; which check or draft shall be not less than 5 per centum of the amount of supplies proposed to be furnished; and in case a bidder on being awarded a contract shall fail to execute the same with good and sufficient sureties, according to the terms on which his bid was made and accepted, the amount so deposited by him shall be forfeited to the United States; otherwise such draft or check will be returned to the bidder. Bids should not be accompanied by cash.

BIDS UNACCOMPANIED BY A CHECK OR DRAFT WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

Bidders are required to furnish samples of the articles bid for in all cases, except such as threshing, mowing, and reaping machines, engines, and like bulky articles; in which case the kind, size, capacity, and quality proposed to be furnished must be fully stated, with cuts in duplicate, the Department reserving the right to call for such samples, if deemed for the best interests of the service. Where the same article is called for a number of times, only of different sizes, such as school desks, rope, buckles, etc., it will be sufficient to put in a sample of one size only, which will be accepted as indicating the kind and quality of all sizes to be furnished. Bids unaccompanied by samples or full descriptions as above required will not be considered. Bidders must attach to each sample offered a plain card or tag, upon which must be marked in plain figures or letters, written with black ink, the number and price of the sample.

As far as practicable samples of each class must be packed separately.

Bids must not be inclosed in packages containing samples.

If more than one sample is offered, they should be packed in a box or bundle, with the bidder's name plainly marked on the outside. The office will attach its own marks by which to identify the samples with the bids. Private marks must not be put upon or attached to samples. In all cases where samples are required they must be delivered at Nos. 265-267 South Canal Street, Chicago, Ill., at or before the time specified for opening bids.

No sample will be opened until after all the bids shall have been publicly read.

A multiplicity of samples should be avoided. In all cases bidders are requested to limit the number of their samples to the number provided for in the blank.

As early as practicable after the reading of the bids the samples offered will be examined and passed upon by some competent person or persons to be appointed by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Parties receiving awards will at once enter into contract. All contracts are subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, and are not binding on the Government until approved by him.

In making awards the right will be reserved to increase or diminish to any extent the quantity of any of the articles embraced in the following schedule, and the further right to increase or decrease the quantities specified in any CONTRACT to an extent not exceeding twenty-five per centum unless otherwise specified. Parties desiring to limit the quantity offered of any article must state in their bids the quantity proposed to be furnished, followed by the word "ONLY," and the right will be reserved to accept any part thereof, not exceeding the amount designated.

Each contract must be accompanied by a bond conditioned upon the faithful performance of the same in all its particulars; said bond to be either a joint and several bond, with two or more sureties, or that of an approved Surety or Trust Company, and to be for at least fifty per centum of the amount of the contract. Bonds must be duly executed according to the laws and regulations governing the same.

No person having an existing contract with the Indian Department will be accepted as a surety on the bond of another contractor.

All articles furnished under contract must be delivered at the places designated for their reception, in new cases, strongly and properly packed in such quantities as may be required; or, if in bales, to be properly bound with iron or rope, in perfect order for shipment, fully and plainly marked, according to directions, and accompanied by not exceeding three invoices for each agency, school, or tribe, without any charge therefor, or for cases, baling, or cooperage, and will be subject to inspection; and such articles as may in any respect fail to conform to the samples will be rejected, and the contractor held to furnish others of the required quality within five days; or, failing in that, they will be purchased at his expense.

Contractors must make delivery of all the articles provided for in their respective contracts, at the earliest date practicable, and WITHIN ninety days from the date of the requisitions for the goods. For failure to deliver the articles or goods contracted for within the said period of ninety days, delay due to acts of God alone excepted, the sum of one per centum of the value of the articles undelivered shall be charged for each five days' (or fraction thereof) delay beyond the time above stated; and said charge of one per centum is hereby agreed and understood beforehand between the parties to the contracts to be liquidated damages to cover all losses that may be sustained by way of penalty. Provided, That, in case of necessity, the Commissioner of Indian Affairs may, in his discretion, extend the period above specified for not exceeding thirty days, upon the written application of the contractor, to be presented to the Commissioner prior to the expiration of the first-named period, in which application shall be clearly shown the reasons, to be accompanied by proper evidence, for the inability of the contractor to make his deliveries within the said period of ninety days; and provided further, That if after the expiration of the extended period of thirty days, if such shall be granted, there is still further delay in the delivery of the goods, the contractor so delinquent shall be liable for damages the same as hereinbefore prescribed. Additional quantities of these supplies that may be ordered under Article 2 of the contracts will be subject to the same conditions.

Delay and difficulty having heretofore been experienced in the proper execution of contracts and bonds in consequence of the absence of one or more members of firms, it is desirable that one member only of a firm sign the bid and propose to enter into contract, thus avoiding the necessity of producing powers of attorney authorizing one member to sign for absent members, as is required by law.

Bids may be for delivery at New York, Chicago, St. Louis, St. Paul, Sioux City, Omaha, or Kansas City—to be specified in the bid—subject to inspection at such points as may be designated by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Attention of bidders is especially invited to the specification relating to points of delivery, and bidders are urged to offer their goods delivered at as many of the specified points as possible, the desire of the Department being to secure the lowest obtainable prices nearest the points of consumption.
