

Sir :

Miss Cynthia E. Webster, an Oneida from Wisconsin, the writer of the enclosed letter, came to Carlisle as a student in September 1888 and graduated in the class of 1896. She afterward attended the high school in the town of Carlisle from which she graduated creditably with her class in 1898. Since that time she has been employed in the Indian school service at various places, mostly as teacher or assistant teacher. This is the first letter I have had from her with anything like a complaint, and as she fitted herself for teaching and that was her ambition it is not to be wondered at that she should feel as she does. She was a thoroughly good girl and of a very happy disposition at Carlisle, and was especially satisfactory in her normal room work.

If Miss Webster could be continued as teacher or assistant teacher I would think her most effective in that capacity, unless her record has been very different since she left here.
