Sir:

Having held the position of drawing teacher here with a salary of \$720 per annum since October 1903, I find myself out of the regular line of promotion, as I hold the only position of its kind in the service. Although I am pleased with the school and the work, I would prefer to have a position in regular teaching in one of the smaller western schools of the service. In fact I would accept such a position at a lower salary if necessary. I feel I could do stronger teaching among smaller numbers where I could know more of the disposition of each pupil.

As for my education and former positions I refer you to my application for Civil Service Examination.
