
To The Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D. C.

Sir:

I understand that Mr. William Denomie, a Chippewa Indian and a graduate of Carlisle, class of 1894, is an applicant for the position of Govt. Farmer on the Lac Court de' Oreille Reservation, Wis., "Soon to be made vacant by the resignation of Nat D. Rodman." I do not know that it is practicable to appoint Mr. Denomie to the position, but if it is I should like to see him have it, as I believe he will be a very good man for the place. When I was an Agent at La Pointe Agency, Denomie taught one of the little day schools on the Lac Court de' Oreille reservation, and as the duties of farmer on your reservation are confined principally to the general charge of the Indian, the duties being of the nature of Special Agent, I believe he will fill the place very satisfactorily. I do not want to run counter to the desires of Mr. Campbell, the Agent, but wish to place myself on record in Mr. Denomie's favor.
