Sir:

In reply to your communication of September 27th, "Education 64053-1904," enclosing a letter from Miss Mollie V. Gaither applying for the position of Outing Agent at this school, I have to say that for the position of Girls' Outing Agent, made vacant by the transfer of Mrs. Cook to Riverside, I have made provision, it being my intention to transfer Miss Ella Hill, now in charge of the laundry and for many years an employee of this school in the capacity of teacher, and one whom I believe particularly well fitted for the position which requires not only a personal acquaintance with the students but also a knowledge of the territory and definite information as to the requirements ^{for} ~~of~~ patrons. In fact, I am inclined to believe that only a person who has had experience here and a personal knowledge of the students could successfully handle that work; at any rate, I should much prefer one with that experience and have promised the place to Miss Hill.

I had expected to fill Miss Hill's place, Laundress \$660 per annum, but if you would like to have that place for Miss Gaither, I will be glad to make my arrangements accordingly. Please advise me. I herewith return Miss Gaither's letter.
