The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D. C.

Sir :

There is transmitted herewith a request, dated the 4th instant, by Mrs. Oella C. Munch, assistant matron at this school, for a transfer to Oklahoma or to Indian Territory, with promotion as matron. Mrs. Munch gives as reason for this request, that her mother's health will not admit of her (Mrs. Munch) going farther from home.

Respecting the request for promotion, I have to state that I am unable to make a definite recommendation based on my own personal knowledge. Inquiry of the matron, however, indicates that Mrs. Munch's work has been reasonably satisfactory, and it is thought probable that in the position of matron in a smaller school where she could have full charge, she would succeed very well.

Should you decide to transfer Mrs. Munch as requested, I will, upon being so advised make definite recommendation as to filling her place here by promotion of an employe now at the school.
