
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Sir:

Attention is hereby respectfully invited to the desirability of granting an increase of salary to the harness maker, tinsmith and painter at this school. Each of these positions pays, at the present time, \$50 per month or \$600 per annum. The men now filling the positions, namely: M. I. Zeigler, harness maker; E. G. Sprow, tinsmith; and Charles H. Carns, painter, are good mechanics and efficient employees and I am of the opinion that their salaries, which, it seems to me, are very low for good mechanics, should be increased at least \$5.00 per month.

It is therefore respectfully recommended that the positions of harness maker, tinsmith and painter at this school at \$600 per annum be abolished to take effect January 31, 1905, and that the same positions at \$660 per annum be authorized to take effect February 1, 1905.
