Sir:

I have the honor to transmit herewith the application of Mr. H. W. Leaman of this place, dated the 3d instant, for a special examination for the position of horticulturist and gardener at this school. Mr. Leaman was employed here about two months last fall under authority from the Office in pruning shade trees and shrubs and otherwise beautifying the school grounds. He demonstrated his capacity for this work and it is very much desired that arrangements be perfected, if possible in accordance with the Civil Service rules, for his permanent employment.


