To the Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Sir:

Replying to your letter (Education) dated the 2d instant relative to the re-examination of Luzena Tibbetts and Annie Goyituey to test their fitness for appointment as teachers at this school, you are advised that the Civil Service Commission sent the papers for such re-examination to me here early in January; that the examination was held without delay; and that about ten days ago these young ladies were advised, respectively, that they had made an eligible percentage in their examinations and were therefore qualified for regular appointment.

It is therefore respectfully recommended that the regular employment of the parties named at \$420 per annum be authorized upon receipt of official notice from the Civil Service Commission that they are duly qualified. Attention is invited in this connection to our letter of December 28th and correspondence previous thereto relative to the appointment of these young ladies as teachers here.

No action was taken by me with reference to this matter since the young ladies received their reports from the Civil Service Commission for the reason that I was waiting for the official report of the Civil Service Commission through your office.
