
Sir:-

Referring to the last paragraph in your letter dated March 25th., marked "Education 22190-1905," inquiring whether Miss Carter was not entitled to sick leave for the time that she was ill. I have the honor to state that she was absent from duty on account of sickness from February 24th. to March 10th. inclusive. She died on the morning of March 11th.


Miss Carter was paid for the entire month of February, our purpose having been to submit her application for sick leave at the expiration of her illness. Under the circumstances no such application could be obtained from her. I therefore respectfully request that the absence from duty from February 24th to Feb. 28th., inclusive, five days, be approved as sick leave with pay.

No intimation has been received from Miss Carter's legal representative that a claim will be made for any further sick leave with pay, and it is not probable that such a claim will be made. If it is the desire of the office that anything further be done in this matter your directions will be complied with.
