Sir:

Replying to your letter "M 26359--1905," dated the 8th instant I have to state that I forwarded to you today under separate cover school room papers and drawings unmounted for the Portland Exposition.


Replying to your inquiry as to what articles we will have to represent the industrial exhibit you are advised that we have prepared and have ready to send some inlaid work, a model five-panel door, a model library table, some mortising, etc., to represent the carpenter shop; the working parts of a front gear for buggy, wing stays, horseshoes and some tools to represent the blacksmith shop; a model buggy body, finished in the paint shop, together with cushions, and also some specimens of lettering and hardwood finishing to represent the carriage and coach painting shop; some boys and girls shoes to represent the shoe shop; some sample parts of harness to represent the harness shop; and also some fancy work to represent the sewing department.

We will also have a small number of articles, perhaps 8 or 10, made in the sloyd room.

If desired we could also include a small uniform suit of clothes for boys to represent the tailor shop.

We have not received any definite instructions from Superintendent Chalcraft with reference to these articles representing the industries and would be glad if you would advise us by return mail what we shall do with the same--whether to ship from here direct to Portland or forward them to the Indian Office. They will perhaps weigh not to exceed 100 pounds.
