
Referring to your letter "Education" dated the 9th instant relative to the appointment of a florist at this school to succeed Mr. H. W. Leaman, now temporarily employed in that position, I have to inclose herewith, in compliance with his request, a communication from the Civil Service Commission dated February 23d last acknowledging the receipt of his application and accompanying papers intended to qualify him for the position of gardener. While it therefore appears that he should have been advised as to the result prior to April 1st he has not yet heard from the Civil Service Commission and does not know whether he qualified or not for the quarter beginning April 1st.

About the middle of March, after the position of florist was created at this school, he states that he also wrote to the Civil Service Commission requesting necessary blanks and instructions with reference to qualifying for this position, but that they informed him there was no such position authorized. He desires that these facts be communicated to your office in order that you may know that he did not neglect the matter of endeavoring to qualify for the position held by him in accordance with the Civil Service rules.

He is anxious to know whether, under the circumstances, anything can be done by your office to secure recognition for him in connection with appointment to the place which he temporarily holds. We have told him that we thought it was too late, inasmuch as another man had been appointed, but that we would communicate with you.

Since the foregoing was prepared we have received a letter from Carl J. Schack, declining the appointment as florist at this school. In view of this fact it is suggested that it may be possible to arrange for the appointment of Mr. Leaman to this position permanently, in accordance with the rules if the situation is understood by the Civil Service Commission. The work in Mr. Leaman's department is pressing for attention just at this time and it is therefore undesirable to make a change at present if it can be avoided.

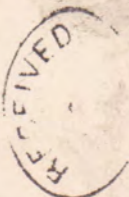
