Referring to your letter to me dated June 10, 1905, in which you quoted from a letter from the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs dated June 8, relative to taking a non-competitive examination for the position of teacher in case I desired a transfer to that branch of the service from that of music teacher, I have to state that when I took the civil service examination for music teacher in the Indian service I think I was given the regular teacher's examination as a basis. In addition to the musical examination I was examined in nature study, writing, spelling, arithmetic, grammar, physical geography, pedagogy, etc., in which branches, I understand, I made an eligible percentage. Under the circumstances I respectfully suggest that I am eligible for appointment to the position of teacher without any further examination.

If not, I would respectfully request that permission be obtained for me to take such examination at the earliest practicable date.
