To the Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:

Referring to your office letter, "Education" dated March 22, 1905, I have the honor to transmit herewith, under separate cover, a set of floor plans of all the buildings on the Carlisle Indian school grounds, and also a set of plans showing front and side elevations of the same. We have attached hereto a synopsis of the several buildings by numbers and names as indicated upon the topographical map of the school grounds sent to you on May 13, 1905, and also indicating the use to which the respective buildings are put.

All of the tracings and plans herewith were made by our Indian boys under the direction of the drawing teacher. This work was delayed for some time awaiting the receipt of tracing cloth from your office which was asked for a second time, and of which a sufficient quantity was subsequently bought here to complete the tracings. No expense other than for the tracing cloth was therefore incurred in connection with this portion of the work.

I respectfully request that at its earliest convenience the Office cause to be made and sent to us here two sets of all of these tracings; also two blue print copies of the topographical map (tracing)

sent you on May 13th above referred to. These maps will be valuable to us here as well as to your office as we shall have occasion frequently to refer to the same.

No. 34, SCHOOL BUILDING:- Two-story red brick; 88x90; one wing 134x36; 19 rooms; used as quarters for employees.
No. 35, COTTAGE:- Two-story frame; double dwelling house; 60 1/2 x 45; of Assistant Discipline.

No. 36, COTTAGE:- One-story frame; 50x36; 4 rooms; used as quarters and six rooms for employees; quarters.

No. 37, DINING HALL:- Two-story frame; 132x92; 48x88; 51 rooms; laundry; excepting 3 rooms used as quarters for employees.

No. 38, LAUNDRY:- One-story built brick; 132x42, 3 rooms; used as fitting shop and fire engine house.
No. 39, BOILER HOUSE:- Two-story painted brick 4 rooms; used for boiler room; coal storeroom; steam

- No. 1, OFFICE:- Two-story red brick , 50x48 ft.; first floor used
for offices; second floor for employees' quarters.
- No.2, SUPERINTENDENT'S QUARTERS:- Two-story painted brick; two wings
18x19', 24 1/2x 15 1/2' and 67 1/2 x 24', ten rooms,
used as quarters of Superintendent.
- No.3, ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S QUARTERS:- two-story frame; one
wing, 29 1/2 x 15 1/2; 37 1/2 x 18 1/2; nine rooms; used
as quarters of assistant superintendent.
- No.4, SMALL BOYS' QUARTERS:- two-story painted brick; 212'x 36';
41 rooms; used as quarters for small boys; except two
rooms, quarters of matron; one room, office; one room
reading room and one room as assembly hall.
- No.5, DISCIPLINARIAN'S QUARTERS:- Two-story frame house; 32x20';
7 rooms; used as quarters for Superintendent of Industries.
- No.6, HOSPITAL:- Two-story frame; one wing 28x50'; 79 1/2 x 27';
24 rooms; used as hospital; contains quarters for Nurse
and Hospital Cook, kitchen, dining room, dispensary,
office, sitting room and wards for sick.
- No.7, STABLES:- Two-story frame; 72x42', four rooms; used for
stabling school horses and as carriagehouse.
- No.8, HOSTLER'S HOUSE:- One-story frame; 44x20 1/2'; 3 rooms;
used as quarters of teamster.
- No.9, SHOPS:- Two-story brick, painted; 168x41; 168x41; 67x36';
22 rooms; used for tailor shop, wood shop, printing office,
blacksmith shop, paint shop, tin shop, shoe shop, carpenter
shop, harness shop, and 6 rooms as quarters.
- No.10, LUMBER HOUSE:- One-story stone building; 54x29', one room;
used as storehouse for lumber.
- No.11, OIL HOUSE:- One-story painted brick, 20x30'; one room; used
in which to store oils and other inflammable material.
- No.12, STOREHOUSE:- Two-story painted brick, 100x60; 6 rooms; used
as general storehouse and office of quartermaster.

- No.13, BOILER HOUSE:- Two-story painted brick
4 rooms; used for boiler room; coal storeroom; steam
fitting shop and fire engine house.
- No.14, LAUNDRY:- One-story buff brick; 138x45' 3 rooms; used as
laundry, excepting 2 rooms used as quarters for employees.
- No.15, DINING HALL:- Two-story frame; 125x82'; 48x36'; 21 rooms;
used for pupils' dining hall, kitchen, bakery, sewing room
and six rooms for employees' quarters.
- No. 16, COTTAGE:- One-story frame; 50x26'; 7 rooms; used as quarters
of Assistant Disciplinarian.
- No.17, COTTAGE:- Two-story frame; double dwelling house; 60 1/2 x 42';
16 rooms; used as quarters for employees.
- No.18, SCHOOL BUILDING:- Two-story red brick; 88x60', one wing 134x36',
one wing 121x36'; 28 rooms; used for school rooms, office
of Principal Teacher, library and chapel.
- No.19, GUARD HOUSE:- One-story; stone; 71x32'; 7 rooms; used as guard
house.
- No.20, TEACHERS' QUARTERS:- Two-story painted brick; three wings
36x24'; main 200x24'; 44 rooms; used for quarters of
employees, employees' kitchen, dining room and parlor.
- No.21, GIRLS' QUARTERS:- Three-story painted brick; two wings 75x36',
main 200x34'; 134 rooms; used as quarters for girls,
assembly hall, small girls' play-room, and quarters for
girls' matrons; also clothing room.
- No.22, GYMNASIUM:- Three-story painted brick; 194x64'; 9 rooms;
Contains gymnasium, boys' shower bathroom; large boys'
reading room; Y.M.C.A. hall, and two boys' society halls.
- No.23, LARGE BOYS' QUARTERS:- Three-story painted brick; 292x36';
92 rooms; used as quarters for large boys, clothing room,
assembly hall, office and 3 rooms used as quarters for
disciplinarians.
- No.24, COAL HOUSE:- One and two-story frame; 84x49'; used for storing
coal and lumber.
- No.25, BAND STAND:- Open frame structure; 30' in diameter.
- No.26, COTTAGE:- Two-story frame double dwelling house; 40x48';
16 rooms; used as quarters for physician and engineer.
