Dear Sir,

I inclose herewith duplicate descriptive statement of three pupils of this school transferred to Carlisle, Penn.

Mr. E. H. Colegrove, the Disciplinarian of the Carlisle School was at this reservation last week, collecting pupils for Carlisle.

Either I do not comprehend the rules given to govern the collection of pupils for transfer, or Mr. Colegrove fails to come up to the requirements.

Mr. Colegrove gave me the names of the following children and youths whom he expected to take with him, but they were not brought to the school, physician for examination.

Jim Maney aged 21/ son of Jasper Maney -1/8 blood
Lucy Maney aged 15, daughter of Jasper Maney. -1/8 blood.
Manley George, aged 14, son of Dawson George, -3/4 blood.
Duffie Smith, aged 21, son of Doc. Smith, -1/2 blood.
Jack Jackson, aged 12, son of Nannie Blythe, -1/8 blood.

I understand that these children were taken to Carlisle.

The railroad agent at Whittier informs me that he furnished Mr. Colegrove twelve tickets as he started for Carlisle. That means that he had still additional children whom he did not report to me at all.

I am informed that he took with him one John Seay, son of Coleman and Mary seay, I notified Mr. Colegrove very plainly that this John Seay was not eligible to transfer to a non-reservation school; both for the reason that he does not have the necessary amount of Indian blood, and

because his parents claimed possession of land inside the Qualla Bounday at the time the intruders were put off, and were paid \$262.50 for their possession, and both of them signed the deed. His father is a White man and his mother is a "White Indian.

The mother may have a small fraction of Indian blood, and on this supposition, I gave the boy a chance in this school but he proved unworthy and I let him go. But in any event, he has not the required amount of Indian blood for transfer, under the rules.

I make these statements because I understand that I must obey the regulations as shown in sections 239 & 240 of the School Rules. If so then Mr. Colegrove has exceeded his authority in taking these children from this reservation without my knowledge, and in one case against my direction.
