To the Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:

In order that I may carry out the change in the policy of the school and assign more boys to the trade of carpentry and push them along further in their work to include sufficient knowledge of construction in addition to their other requirements; to the end that when we turn them out they will be competent to initiate work and to at once command carpenter's wages, it will be necessary to have an additional instructor. At present the shop work and instruction in the shop requires the constant attendance of the shop instructor which leaves me but one instructor for outside work, and when he is engaged, as at present, on work such as the addition to the chapel that will occupy his time for several months, I am unable to do other necessary carpenter work, and the result is that matters have been hanging on for several months that should have been completed long ago and I have reached a condition of affairs where to initiate anything new is simply out of the question. We will have about eighty boys under instruction in carpentry, which gives us about forty boys in the morning and forty in the afternoon in the shop or at work outside, and we really need an additional carpenter here.

I therefore recommend that an additional position of assistant carpenter at \$720 per annum be authorized; that a suitable man be sent me from the classified service; and that I be permitted to employ a carpenter temporarily at not to exceed \$2.50 per day.

Sir:

I have the honor to transmit herewith application of Miss Anne H. Stewart, sloyd teacher at this school, to be detailed to summer school from August 1st to August 31st. This application has been disapproved and in connection therewith I respectfully invite attention to my letter of May 29th recommending certain changes at this school including the abolishment of the position of sloyd teacher. It appears that Miss Stewart is eligible to transfer to a position of teacher in the school service and it is respectfully recommended that such a position be offered her between this date and the date of expiration of her annual leave, July 31st. Miss Stewart left here for her home at Quincy, Ill., on the 1st instant and I feel that it is not necessary to continue the position of sloyd teacher here after the expiration of her annual leave.
