
To the Honorable,

Sir:

I have the honor to forward herewith letter of Miss Frances A. Veitch, Matron, of this date, asking if she is eligible to transfer to any other bureau.

Miss Veitch was formerly teacher; was transferred as assistant matron here; promoted to matron, and now desires transfer as clerk. She gives as a reason for desiring transfer that she does not feel that interest in children which she should feel and prefers clerical duty. I think she would make a very competent clerk. I recommend that she be so transferred if practicable, as whatever her qualifications may be as a matron, while she feels as she does in regard to her duties and admits that they are distasteful, she will not of course be a success as a matron.
