
To the Honorable,
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D. C.

Sir:

It is my sad duty to report the drowning at Ocean City, N.J., yesterday afternoon of Nora Printup, an Indian girl from the Seneca tribe, Basom, N.Y., aged 19 years. We have but few particulars respecting the accident, though it seems that she remained in the water until she became exhausted, got out beyond her depth, and was drowned before she could be rescued. Persistent efforts were made to resuscitate her but without success.

We have not yet heard from her father who was advised of the accident last night, but it is intended, if he so desires, to have the remains forwarded to his home.
