
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Sir:

I enclose herewith a letter dated September 26th, 1905 from C. Lantz of Salem, Mass. and accompanying application of John Jos. Lewey for enrollment as a pupil at this school. It appears that this young man is an Indian of the Micmac tribe, born in New Brunswick, aged twenty years. From the attached paper it appears that he has made application for citizenship in the United States.

We are somewhat in doubt as to whether the benefits of the Government Indian Schools may be extended to cases like this where the applicant is of foreign birth. It appears that he is a full blood Indian, and from the correspondence, seems to be altogether deserving. Please instruct us.
