The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,



Sir:

Referring to notice dated the 24th ultimo from the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs of the appointment of James Meehan, of New York, as assistant carpenter at this school at \$720 per annum, I have to state that the ten days within which to report have expired and that he has not put in his appearance, nor have we heard from him. The inference is that he will not accept the appointment.

In this connection I have to state, in pursuance of instructions from the Superintendent, Major Mercer, that we would be glad indeed to have Daniel A. Reed, who is at present temporarily employed in this position, appointed to the place if it can be done in accordance with the Civil Service rules and requirements. Mr. Reed has recently taken the examination for carpenter and on the 26th ultimo he received notice of his rating from the Civil Service Commission in which it appears that his average rating is 93.80 per cent. His several ratings on which the average is based are, age 79, physical condition 90, experience 100. Mr. Reed is a good mechanic and a man of good habits and character and, as stated, we would be glad to have him appointed to the place if it can be accomplished.
