The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:

Answering Office letter "Education" dated the 20th instant in reference to the temporary appointment of Mrs. MacKey as matron at this school and requesting that recommendation for filling the position permanently should be submitted at once in order to be considered, you are advised that hopes had been entertained that matters might be so adjusted without violation of the Civil Service rules as to permit of the continued employment of Mrs. MacKey temporarily until the examination required of matrons might be taken by her. Since the aforesaid office letter was received the matter of arranging for the nomination of some one who is eligible for the place has been diligently pursued but so far without definite results. The position is such an important one and means so much for the welfare of the girls and the success of the school that we are extremely anxious to choose the person to fill the place, if possible. It is now thought that the Superintendent will be able to submit a definite recommendation not later than Monday the 27th instant and it is respectfully requested that the matter of filling the place be held in abeyance until that date.
