On December 6th, it was reported by the school physician that Jesse Jamison, a student under treatment in the hospital for Brights' disease, needed a special kind of underwear, and that in his condition, to delay furnishing same, was likely to result disastrously to the boy's health, and might endanger his life. As there was no underclothing of the kind desired on hand, it was necessary to purchase and under the circumstances it was not advisable to wait until authority was obtained and bids from different dealers invited. Two suits were accordingly purchased at the most convenient place, and I submit herewith invoice for same showing cost to be \$5.50.
