To the Honorable,

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:

Referring to the vacancy in the position of teacher at \$660 per annum at this school occasioned by the transfer of Miss Sadie F. Robertson to the position of matron, you are advised that under date of December 1, 1905, a letter was addressed, through the superintendent, to Miss Cloy Montgomery, teacher at the Sac & Fox Indian School, Oklahoma, asking her whether she would consider the proposition to be transferred to Carlisle at the salary of \$600 per annum.

We are now in receipt of a reply dated the 4th instant from Miss Montgomery in which she states that she would be glad to accept the position in question, but says she would prefer not to take up the work until the first of the new year as the work at Sac and Fox would be greatly inconvenienced by her leaving at this time. Miss Montgomery's letter, which is inclosed herewith, is not indorsed by Superintendent Kohlenberg, but apparently it went through his office, as indicated by the date stamp. There is nothing to indicate that the superintendent approves or disapproves of the transfer.

It is respectfully recommended that the necessary steps be taken to effect the transfer of Miss Montgomery to Carlisle at \$600

per annum, to take effect not later than January 1st, provided Superintendent Kohlenberg approves of the same. While the services of Miss Montgomery are required immediately, it being impracticable to secure supply teachers here in Carlisle temporarily, it is realized that it would perhaps be unfair to transfer her until her successor can be arranged for at Sac and Fox school. I trust, however, that prompt action may be taken, to the end that the transfer may be effected or other arrangements made to fill our vacancy here before January 1st.

It is the purpose of the Superintendent to nominate one of our present teachers here for the vacancy at \$660 per annum and to give Miss Montgomery the vacancy thus created at \$600. This is thought to be only fair to our old teachers, especially as Miss Montgomery is willing to be transferred at \$600. It is not desired however, to make a definite recommendation at this time until it is known that the transfer in question will be made.
