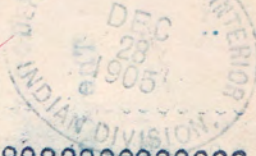

Sir:

Enclosed herewith is a voucher for services in examining applicants for admission to this school, by C. McConnel, M.D. of Hogsburg, New York.

His bill attached to enclosed voucher claims payment for 18 applicants examined; our enrollment shows only nine admitted, whose names are given in voucher. They belong to the item in bill "12 examinations for Margaret DeLemere" and there is no record of the remaining three, as to whether they were rejected by the physician, or for what reason they failed to come.

The "6 Examinations, Alice Conners" is not included in the voucher as the applicants offered by her were rejected as too young, and for the reason that she was not authorized to solicit pupils for this school, the expense incurred by her in examining is not considered a proper charge against the Government.

In the case of the twelve examinations shown by the first item of Dr. McConnel's bill authority is requested for payment. The names of the three applicants not enrolled are unknown.
