Sir:

Replying to Office letter "Education" dated the 11th instant, I have to say that a letter was written to Salem L. Moses on the 12th asking him to advise you at once whether he would accept the position of carpenter at the Cheyenne River School. We now have the following reply from him, dated at the Thomas Indian School, Iroquois, N.Y., January 14, 1906:

"Yours of the 12th received and also the one from the Commissioner offering me the position of carpenter at the Cheyenne River boarding school. I have been turning the question over in my mind, as I have been filling the position of a teamster at this school. I shall wire the Indian Office if I accept the position. Thanking you for having forwarded the appointment to me."
