The Secretary of the Interior.

Sir:-

On October 12, 1905, the Acting Superintendent of the Carlisle Indian School reported that E. G. Sprow, instructor of tinsmithing, when directed by the superintendent of industries to take charge of certain work, protested against doing so, and that afterward an altercation occurred and Mr. Sprow struck the superintendent of industries. The Acting Superintendent thereupon suspended Mr. Sprow for insubordination, pending instructions from this Office. On October 14, 1905, the action of the ^{Acting} Superintendent was approved, and he was directed to prefer charges against Mr. Sprow and receive his answer, as required by the regulations.

The affidavits of all parties having been taken, Supervisor of Indian Schools F. M. Conser was directed to make an investigation. His report has been received, from which I am of opinion that Mr. Sprow has been guilty of conduct highly prejudicial to good discipline, and therefore respectfully recommend that authority be granted for his dismissal from the Service, to take effect from and after October 12, 1905, the date of his suspension for insubordination.
