Authority is respectfully requested to expend not to exceed \$35.00 in the purchase of 100 diplomas for this school.

While thirty diplomas in addition to what we now have on hand would be sufficient for our use this year, we have been informed by Messrs. Maverick & Wissinger, of New York, who have heretofore furnished the diplomas for this school and who have the plate for same, that they cannot supply 30 diplomas for less than \$20.00, but that they can furnish 100 for \$35.00. Inasmuch as the additional diplomas will be needed hereafter, it is deemed to be a matter of economy to purchase 100 now.
