Sir:

Referring to Office letter "Education 15078", dated the 19th instant, from the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs, relative to the appointment of Juliette Smith to the position of baker at the Wittenberg school, Wisconsin, I have to state that Miss Smith is a student in the senior class and will graduate at our next commencement, March 22d.
