
Sir:

Referring to the services of Mrs. Elizabeth C. Sloan, Assistant Matron, whose probationary period terminated on the 7th instant, she having entered upon duty September 7, 1905, I have to state that it was my full intention to make report in this case in ample time for the Office to have taken action before the six months expired, but that the matter was overlooked by the clerks in this office. I therefore wish to say now that, in my opinion, Mrs. Sloan is not fitted for the position of matron or assistant matron in the Indian service, and especially in a large school like Carlisle, and that the welfare of the service will not be promoted by her retention in permanent employment.

Therefore, if it is not too late, I would recommend that the services of Mrs. Sloan be dispensed with from and after the date of the receipt of this letter by your Office, or such date as you may see fit to fix, and that she be notified accordingly.




