
The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:

It being very necessary that the industries of bricklaying, plastering and cement work be established here, both to supplement the work of the other trades and also to save considerable annual expense in the employment of irregular labor for work in those lines, I have requested on my annual list of positions and salaries for the next fiscal year that an instructor for the three trades combined be authorized at \$720 per annum, but inasmuch as a great deal of work in bricklaying, plastering and cement working will be required within the next two or three months, and as we have a number of boys available for that work, I have to request that I be authorized to employ temporarily at the rate of \$720 per annum an instructor, unless your Office will find it convenient to authorize the permanent position at once, which would be a better way, in that case giving me authority to employ temporarily until the position can be permanently filled.
