Sir:

Referring to your Office letter dated the 7th instant and also to the one dated the 12th in regard to printing the report of Mr. C. E. Kelsey, there is transmitted herewith proof copy of about three-fourths of the said report. The job was found to be a much larger one than we had counted upon and the proof herewith represents all the type we have, so that further work in the way of composing had to be suspended. Immediately upon receipt of the proof from your Office the requisite number of first sheets will be printed and the type distributed so that the balance of the report may be set up. The remainder of the proof will then be forwarded to you for examination.

We regret exceedingly that our facilities were not sufficient to enable us to complete the whole job at one time and we trust that the delay incident to making two jobs of it will not inconvenience the Office unduly.

As you are aware five or six of our best printers and compositors were members of the recent graduating class and have left the school which has also handicapped us somewhat in getting out a piece of work of this size. We will do the very best we can to expedite the completion of the work under the circumstances.
