
Referring to Office letter "Education 100419-1906(?)" dated May 9th, from the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs, in regard to the continuation of Mr. Philibert Lutz as fireman at this school, I have to state that such continued employment has been necessary owing to the unusually cool weather for the season, thus rendering it necessary to continue the use of the steam plant at almost its full capacity. Besides, the engineer, Mr. Weber, has had an unusual amount of outside work this spring so that the employment of experienced foremen in the boiler house was almost absolutely necessary.

Attention is invited in this connection to the inclosed report of the U. S. Civil Service Commission dated February 20, 1906, showing the rating of Mr. Lutz as a result of his examination for fireman. It will be noted that he is given an average of 81 per cent and that for experience he is only rated at 70. This latter figure seems to us rather low as the engineer reports that Mr. Lutz is not only a faithful employee and discharges his duties very satisfactorily but that he is an experienced fireman; in fact, he has pursued this work for a number of years. If it can be accomplished in accordance with the Civil Service rules we would be glad indeed to have Mr. Lutz permanently appointed as fireman.

Attention is invited to my letter of the 11th instant forwarding the resignation of Stephen Albanez as fireman. It will not be necessary, it is thought, to fill this position until about the first of next November. If, however, the employment of Mr. Lutz cannot be continued it will be very necessary that an experienced fireman be appointed and employed in his place.

Please return the inclosed report of rating of Mr. Lutz.
