Sir:

Referring to Office letter "Education 44131-1906" from the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs, I have to state that we are in receipt of a letter from Superintendent J. C. Hart dated the 23d instant saying that Miss Macy does not feel that it would be quite fair, in view of her qualifications and experience, to take a subordinate position at a smaller salary as assistant matron here. She does not therefore think it best to accept the position now vacant here.

I have no other recommendation to make in connection with filling this vacancy and I have therefore to request that an appointment be made from the register of eligibles on the Civil Service list, the appointee to be a single woman having good health and strong physique. A young woman would be preferred. We have no quarters here for children of such employee, who would be required to have her room in the girls' dormitory; hence the request for a single woman.
