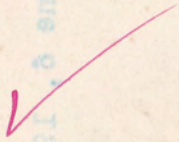



Sir:

Referring to the examination of Adaline E. Kingsley for the position of matron, you are advised that she took such examination on the 17th ultimo and that she is now in receipt of advice from the Civil Service Commission dated the 1st instant that she has passed the examination, making an eligible percentage of 78.75.

It is assumed that this makes her eligible to appointment in the Indian Service as matron or seamstress. She is anxious to get a position at Wittenberg or some other school near her home in Wisconsin, and if any such vacancy occurs I trust that you will give her name due consideration.
