On or about November 1894, I adopted an Indian child he is or will be 14 years old in the month of November next, he is very anxious to go to school, and being a bright and intelligent boy, I would like to get him into "Carlisle Indian School", Carlisle, Pa. until he is of the age of 21 years, and if he should wish to stay there after that age of course that would be a matter for him to settle for himself.

The boy speaks good English, and never was taught his own language he has been going to school here, and now wishes a higher education, I would like to give it to him myself, but unfortunately I am not in a position to do so as I am getting old and it takes all I can earn to keep myself.

The boy was born at Onoclit, 100 miles north of St. Michaels, November 1892. His father's name was Cochrane, but has assumed my own.

Will you kindly let me know what steps to take to accomplish in getting the boy into the Carlisle Indian School, and give what assistance you can in the matter.
