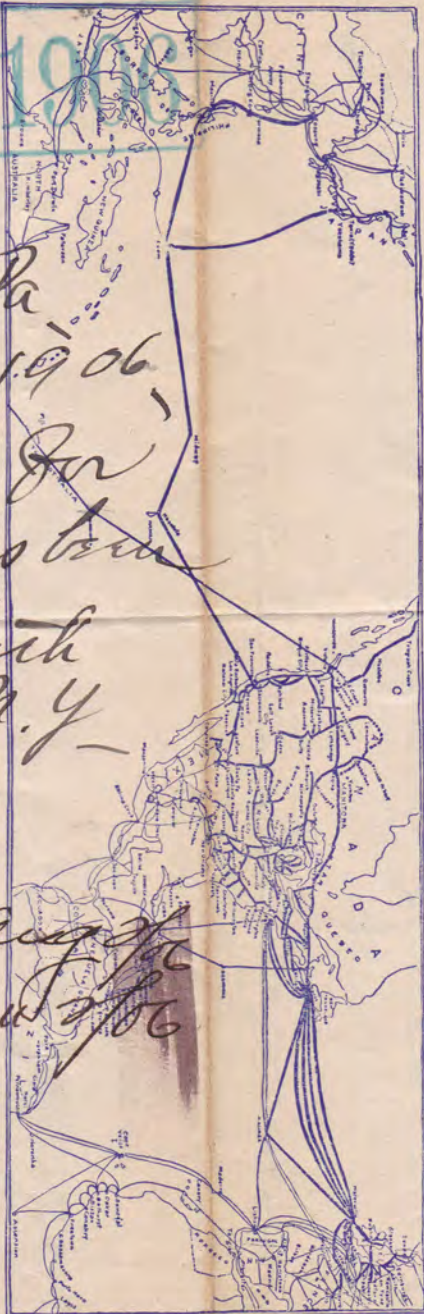

TRANSMITS AND DELIVERS THE WITHIN MESSAGE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

The greatest against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message would never if RECEIVED in that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this one-half the regular rate is charged for delivery in the afternoon, or for non-delivery, of any uninterfered message beyond fifty lines the amount received for sending the same; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any uninterfered message beyond fifty lines the amount received for sending the same; unless special rates are provided for in any case, or delays arising from unavoidable interruptions in the working of its lines, or for errors in cipher or other messages. And this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability to forward any message over the lines of any other company when necessary to reach its destination. Correctness in the transmission of messages by any party on the lines of the Company shall be insured by contract in writing, at a rate not exceeding 1,000 miles and two per cent. for any premium thereon, at the following rates, in addition to the usual charges for repeated messages, viz.: one per cent. for any distance not exceeding 1,000 miles and two per cent. for any greater distance.

No responsibility regarding messages or notices of this Company until the same are presented and accepted at one of its transmitting offices; and if a message is sent to such office by one of this Company's representatives, he acts for that purpose as the agent of the sender. For delivery at a greater distance special charges will be made to cover the cost of such delivery. Messages will be delivered within the established free delivery limits of the terminal office. Messages which the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the Company for transmission, or which are not delivered by request of the sender under the conditions named above. Errors shall be guarded against only by repeating a message back to the sending station.

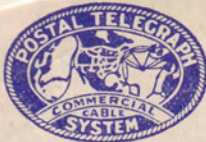
